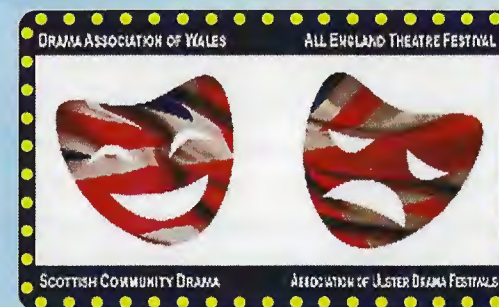

Rhyl is a Welsh seaside town and community in the county of Denbighshire. It lies on the North-East coast of Wales at the mouth of the River Clwyd. Rhyl has long been a popular tourist destination and was once an elegant victorian resort. This changed dramatically after the Second World War and during the 1950's and 60's attracted holidaymakers from far and wide, but in particular from Liverpool and Manchester.

The area had declined substantially by 1990 but has since seen major improvements with a series of regeneration projects that have brought in major investments. Several million pounds of EU funding has been spent on the Rhyl seafront.
