The Legacy Fund

This was set up by the National Executive Committee in 2019 in thanks for a generous anonymous donation made to the AFTE.

We have added to the fund a donation from the AETF and other donations.

There are two ways which will enable us to make this bursary available well into the future: -

- 1. Annual Membership Donations, 'made by our members when renewing their membership'.
- 2. Any profits made on a workshop or seminar which are returned to the AETF.

The Legacy Fund is enabling the AETF to extend our aims of encouraging and enhancing the grass roots development of amateur drama in England.

Application Process

- Applications are invited from any opting group entering a Preliminary Round Festival of the AETF.
- 2. The Bursary is for £300, to run a Workshop or Seminar aimed at grass roots groups.
- 3. There will be one Bursary per Area each year: -
 - Applications must be with the Area Secretary by the Semi-Final.
 - The decision as to the Winner will be made by the Area Committee.
 - The winner will be announced at each Semi-Final
 - The Bursary (cheque) will be presented at the English Final in June.
- 4. A Bursary winner will not be able to reapply within a three-year period.
- 5. The running of the event is entirely at the discretion of the organiser.

 The workshop or seminar can either be free of charge to participants or a small charge can be levied to cover additional costs to create a small profit.

e.g.

- Number of participants, 25 at £25 each, giving an income of £625.
- Tutors cost including expenses £300
 Room Hire and refreshments £200,
 giving an expenditure of £500.
- 6. On the above example, the AETF would expect £125 to be returned. This to go into the Legacy Fund, to help continue the bursary in future years.
- Following the event a 'Review' must be sent to the Area Secretary for inclusion in the AETF's newsletter.
